The IFQ Permit Report for permit 980030.

We are unable to document the bycatch on these reports, as the division of IFQ is based upon IFQ permits and the division of bycatch is based upon the CFEC permits.

We hope this report will prove to be helpful to most fishers requesting documentation for hired skippers.

## What's on the fish ticket

The eLandings generated fish ticket includes quite a bit of information that can be helpful. Included on the fish ticket is the CFEC serial number, which replaces the SSN as the unique identifier of the fisher.

## Helpful Reminders

All landings reports can be submitted as an initial report and final report. This function allows you to add grading/sizing/pricing information after the initial documentation, including signatures, has occurred.

Please finalize all landing reports. When the report is finalized, this communicates to management agencies that the report is completed. The report is no longer displayed in the listing.

Landing reports are always available to review and correct if necessary. You can locate an individual landing report or a group of landing reports from the Search function. Full documentation on how to use the eLandings Web search capability can be accessed in the Users Manual.

A good practice would be to review the status of all landing reports at the end of a fishery and finalize all initial status reports.
